SCHOLARSHIP

My research focuses on the intersections between the sport industry and social politics in the second half of the twentieth century. Primarily, I am interested in the connections between American professional football and how the sport intersected with social movements and cultural politics. My work focuses on both how individuals and groups used the sport as a place to disseminate political ideals, but also how league owners, coaches, and administrators responded at both an individual and institutional level to politics in sport. In my second area of research, I am interested in the connections between professional sports teams in the United States and urban politics. Specifically, I am concerned with the financing of sports stadiums, how professional sports teams affected communities, and how communities affected professional sports teams, with an emphasis on franchise relocation.
